It can take several days for mail to get to camp since there are only a couple of trips taken to town each week, so **write early**. Camp Unalayee strongly discourages sending packages that contain any type of perishable food (they can sit in the post office for days). Please do not send packages via FedEx (they can't find us).

If you have not already returned the Medical Exam Form, this form must be returned, signed by parent/guardian and medical personnel, **at least 3 weeks** prior to the session the camper will attend. No camper may attend Camp Unalayee without these completed forms.

**Traveling Plans:** If you are planning on traveling while your child attends camp, please **send** a trip itinerary and contact names and numbers where you can be reached.

**Visitors:** Visitors must have prior permission and a parent must accompany anyone under 18 years of age.

We advise bringing **inexpensive** fishing gear, cameras, musical pieces, etc.

### Equipment List For Campers

Weather at Camp can be hot during the day, always chilly at night, and may have occasional rainstorms. This past winter brought record levels of snow. Campers spend the whole time outdoors so clothes will get dirty. Campers do laundry by hand as an optional activity.

**Please label *everything* clearly with your Camper's name.** This includes socks.

Camp Unalayee cannot be responsible for lost or misplaced items. Although we do our best if things are left up at camp, it is difficult to always get them back to you. We have a lost and found session everyday campers are at base camp to help campers keep track of their equipment.

Don't forget money for the bus ride to and from camp.

No electronics, please! Cell phones, iPods, MP3 players, portable DVD players, Nintendo DS and other handheld gaming consoles, etc., are not allowed at Camp. If they are brought for use on the bus, while at Camp they will be stored in a secure lock box.

### Shoes

Important! Hiking is a part of Camp Unalayee. Please bring good quality shoes and boots. It is also important to have the footwear well broken-in by the time campers arrive at camp. They will be walking everywhere they go. It is especially important to have footwear that will keep campers feet dry in years when we have a wet spring preceding the summer season.

- 1 pair light or medium weight hiking boots (break boots in before hand)
- 6 pairs heavy wool or synthetic socks
- 15 pairs cotton or liner socks (please, label)
- 1 or 2 pairs tennis shoes

No sandals are allowed.

### Clothing (for 15 day session)

- Rain Gear - 1 waterproof nylon parka or poncho is essential
- 1 warm Jacket
- 1- 2 Sweaters or Sweatshirts - a fleece, wool, or synthetic is preferred in case of rain
- 2+ pairs long pants - one should be sweats, fleece or other non-jeans
- 3 pairs shorts
- Swim Suit
- 2 - 3 Long sleeved shirt - poly pro or synthetic long underwear is great
- 15 changes of underwear
- 10 T-shirts /tank-tops
- Sun Hat
- Warm Hat (wool is best)

### Camping Equipment

- Duffle bag
- Ground Cloth\*\* - Nylon or Plastic Sheet 7' by 4'
- Sleeping Bag w/ Stuff Sack\*\*
- Pad - Thermarest, Ensolite or similar sleeping pad\*\*
- Backpack\*\*
- Flashlight w/ extra batteries
- Plastic Bowl and Cup - No 'Mess Kits' please
- Silverware (Fork & Spoon)
- 2 Water bottles - any type of 32 ounce bottle
- Sunglasses
- 50 - 100 feet nylon cord

\*\* Camp has a limited amount of equipment to loan out to campers who need them. Please contact the camp office for more information.

### Toiletries/Personal

- Toothbrush, toothpaste, floss, etc.
- **Sunscreen \*IMPORTANT** Lots of sun!
- Hair Brush or Comb
- **Lip Protection** & lotion (the air is dry)
- **Bug Repellent** - NON-AEROSOL
- Bathing and swim towels
- Laundry Bag

### Bus Directions

#### Palo Alto

Departures and arrivals are from the Cubberly Community Center parking lot, 4000 Middlefield Road, Palo Alto.

Directions from Santa Cruz and other points south of Palo Alto:

- Take 17N to 85N to 101N to the first exit
- Old Middlefield Way merges into Middlefield Road
- Go past San Antonio Road to the third signal light-Montrose Ave.
- The driveway to the parking lot is on the left-hand

Directions from points north of Palo Alto:

- Take 101S to San Antonio Rd.
- Turn right onto Middlefield Rd.

***Please arrive by 6:30 a.m. Return pick up time: 5:00p.m.***

#### Berkeley

Departures and arrivals will be from the Cal Adventures & Sailing Club parking lot, in the Berkeley Marina on University Av

Directions coming from the south on 580 or 80:

- Take Interstate 80 to Powell St. take a left under the freeway and right onto Frontage Rd.
- Follow Frontage Rd. to University Ave - The Seabreeze Market is on the corner
- Take a left onto University and follow the directions below

Directions coming from the South on 880:

- Take the University Ave. exit and the lower ramp that goes under the freeway
- Take a right at the first intersection (Hearst) and go up Hearst to 6th Street light
- Take a right onto 6th and the next right onto University
- Go over the overpass, continue straight into the Marina, and follow directions below

Directions coming from the north:

- Take Interstate 80 and get off at the University Avenue exit in Berkeley
- Take a right onto University toward the Bay. Continue down University, the road will straighten out after the 2<sup>nd</sup> stop sign (Marina St.) turn into the dirt parking lot with the Cal Adventure sign. If you go too far you will come to the Berkeley pier.

***Please arrive by 8:00 a.m. Return pick up time: 4:00p.m.***

#### Dunnigan

Departures and arrivals are from the Dunnigan rest stops.

On the way TO camp:

The stop is just north of the intersection of I-5 and I-505, north of Dunnigan, on the east (north-bound) side.

On the RETURN from camp:

The stop is on the west (south-bound) side of I-5.

***Please arrive by 10:00 a.m. Return pick up time: 2:00p.m.***

#### Redding

Departures and arrivals are from the McDonald's on Cypress Ave, about 1/4 mile east of exit. Please arrive on time.

***Departures at 12:00pm Return pick Up time: 11:00am***

## Camp Unalayee

### Finding Scott Mountain Summit

***Please drop campers off by 3:00 p.m. and pick them up at 9:00 a.m.***

WARNING: Do NOT follow the Google Maps directions to get to Scott Mountain Summit. They WILL get you lost.

#### **From Oregon and the North:**

- Take I-5 South to Yreka
- Take exit 773 towards CA-3/Fort Jones/Etna
- Turn right at the end of the off-ramp
- Turn left on to Hwy 3 South (the first stoplight) towards Fort Jones and Etna
- Turn left at Etna to stay on Hwy 3 towards Callahan and Weaverville
- 14.5 miles past Etna and 2 miles past Callahan veer right to stay on Hwy 3 towards Weaverville and Trinity Center
- Scott Mountain Summit is about 7 miles up on the right
- About 2 hours driving time from the Oregon border

#### **From the Bay Area or Sacramento Area:**

- Take I-5 North to Weed
- Take exit 751 towards Edgewood/Gazelle
- Go left under I-5
- Go right @ the stop sign towards Gazelle (Stewart Springs Rd./Old Hwy 99)
- Go 7.2 miles to Gazelle and turn left on Gazelle-Callahan Rd.
- Go 24.7 miles and take a left onto Hwy 3 towards Trinity Center and Weaverville
- Scott Mountain Summit is about 7 miles up on the right
- About 6 hours driving time from the Bay Area

#### **From Arcata and the Coast:**

- Take Hwy 299 East towards Weaverville/Redding
- Go 93.4 miles and turn left on to Hwy 3 North/Lake Trinity Blvd towards Trinity Center
- Scott Mountain Summit is about 55 miles, on the left
- About 3.5 hours driving time from Arcata
